CIRM Does the ICOC Agree with Nominations



CIRM will provide list of nominees to ICOC for ethicists and scientists with:

- Biography that includes description of area of expertise, ethical/scientific/medical training, affiliations, honors/accomplishments
- ✓ Specific gap or need that nominee fulfills
- ✓ How nominee was identified (e.g., recommendation from ISSCR)
- ✓ History of service to CIRM (e.g., GWG reviewer, CAP advisor)
