

## **CCCEs Are Infrastructure Supporting Access**



Community Care Centers of Excellence are infrastructure described in Proposition 14.



The CCCEs are designed to serve as a hub for expanding access to clinical trials, regenerative medicine treatments and CIRM education and training programs. A strategic aim is to provide equitable access to communities and populations that would otherwise have more limited opportunities in the absence of these centers.

Infrastructure: The resources (such as personnel or equipment) required for an activity.




## **Typical Clinical Teams Include**

- Data management







#### **Core Eligibility and Activities**



- <u>Clinical Operations</u>: Have a licensed and certified healthcare facility with a demonstrated capacity to support <u>human subjects protocols</u> in a health research context. Have current capacity or be in the process of developing capacity to <u>support clinical research</u> protocols involving cell, gene, or regenerative medicine treatments. Do not administer unauthorized stem cell treatments.
- <u>Career Development:</u> Have a demonstrated capacity to support education, training, and career development of physicians, nurses, research coordinators, community health workers, or other health/medical professionals.
- Outreach and Engagement: Have a demonstrated track record of conducting or coordinating health education, research, and engagement activities. Create partnerships with Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) to support program objectives.



## **Activities Supported by CCCE Award**



#### Clinical Operations:

- 1. Support Site: Supporting access to regenerative medicine clinical trials or approved products.
- 2. Support and Delivery Site: Develop the capacity to deliver investigational or regenerative medicine products during the award period, and do not administer unauthorized stem cell treatments.
- <u>Career Development:</u> Adapt, apply, or otherwise utilize EDUC and other CIRM training resources. Serve as a placement site for CIRM scholars and trainees. Integrate regenerative medicine into navigator and community health worker certification programs.
- <u>Outreach and Engagement</u>: Extend, develop programs, and create partnerships with Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) to support clinical research or care, career development, and community engagement.

#### **Ethics Policy Considerations**



- <u>Human Subjects Protocols</u>: Research (clinical or otherwise) involving human participation requiring review and ongoing oversight by an institutional review board (IRB) and other oversight bodies may be required.
- <u>Unauthorized "Stem Cell" Treatments:</u> The applicant organization must not provide direct-to-consumer fee for service interventions involving "stem cell therapies" subject to the notice requirements of <u>CA Bus & Prof Code § 684 (2018).</u>
- Research Ethics Training: Include research ethics training for partners consistent with requirements for clinical and social science research.



#### **Program Considerations**



- <u>Sustainable Education and Navigation</u>: Develop education and navigation programs around reimbursable activities. Specific opportunities include patient navigator and community health worker certification programs.
- <u>Coordination with CIRM Education Programs:</u> CIRM is developing an Educational Portal to support training and career development. Career development opportunities will be publicized through the portal.
- Engaging Patients with Rare Diseases: Utilize Alpha Clinics cohort development tools and conduct pre-application webinars to connect applicants to disease advocacy organizations.



#### **Hypothetical Budget for Support and Delivery Site**



- A budget allocation of \$60.2 million is proposed
- The budget is designed to support program (1) core operations,
   (2) community partnerships, (3) building renovation, and
   equipping facilities for a five-year duration
- The total five-year budget proposal is an estimate assuming the following distribution of awards:
  - Three "Support and Delivery" awards at \$10.054 million per award
  - Four "Support" awards at \$7.5 million per award
