

4	SO I TOO AGREE THAT, FOR A SIX-MONTH
5	PERIOD, IT SEEMS LIKELY TO ME THAT WE COULD DO
6	WITHOUT A CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR AND HAVE ANY
7	ESSENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES DELEGATED TO OTHER
8	MEMBERS OF THE TEAM AND THE BOARD.
9	CHAIRMAN IMBASCIANI: DEBORAH, I THINK, IS
10	NEXT.
11	DR. DEAS: YES, THANK YOU. I'D LIKE TO
12	TAKE A DIFFERENT APPROACH, NOT APPROACH, BUT OPINION
13	TO THIS AND STATE THAT I WOULD BE SUPPORTIVE OF
14	HAVING AN INTERIM, REMEMBERING THAT WE ARE DOING THE
15	WORK ON BEHALF OF THE PEOPLE OF CALIFORNIA. WHEN WE
16	SET OUT TO DO THIS, WE FELT IT WAS NECESSARY TO HAVE
17	NOT ONLY A PERSON IN THE PRESIDENT'S ROLE, BUT ALSO
18	A CEO. AND I THINK THAT THE IMPLICATION TO THE
19	PEOPLE OF NOT HAVING AN INTERIM MINIMIZES THE ROLE
20	OF THE PRESIDENT AND THE CEO. THAT PERSON IS NOT
21	THERE JUST TO DO THE DAY-TO-DAY TRANSACTIONAL
22	THINGS, BUT TO PROVIDE VISION AND LEADERSHIP.
23	WE'VE LAUNCHED A STRATEGIC PLAN, AND THERE
24	ARE OTHER ACTIVITIES THAT ARE ONGOING THAT SHOULD
25	NEED THE LEADERSHIP OF AN INDIVIDUAL TO HELP STEER

1	IT.
2	AND AS WE THINK ABOUT A NEW PRESIDENT AND
3	CEO, I'M HEARING THAT WE'RE GOING TO HAVE THE
4	COMMITTEE MEET ON A MONTHLY BASIS. I'M ALSO HEARING
5	THAT IT'S GOING TO TAKE SIX MONTHS. AND IF WE COULD
6	OPERATE CIRM FOR SIX MONTHS WITHOUT A PRESIDENT AND
7	A CEO, PERHAPS WE NEED TO RETHINK WHETHER WE NEED A
8	PRESIDENT AND A CEO.
9	I THINK IN ANY ORGANIZATION AS LARGE AND
10	THAT IS DOING THIS MEANINGFUL WORK THAT WE ARE
11	DOING, WE REALLY NEED SOMEONE AT THE HELM. AND IT
12	SHOULDN'T BE THE CHAIR AND CO-CHAIR OF THE BOARD
13	REACHING IN TO THE DAY-TO-DAY FUNCTION OF CIRM.
14	CHAIRMAN IMBASCIANI: SO I HAVE FOUR HANDS
15	UP. IF IT DOESN'T
16	VICE CHAIR BONNEVILLE: FIVE HANDS. JOE,
17	MARK, JUDY, LINDA, AND ANNE-MARIE.
18	CHAIRMAN IMBASCIANI: JOE FOLLOWED BY MARK
19	FISCHER-COLBRIE THEN. MR. PANETTA, THANK YOU.
20	MR. PANETTA: THANKS, VITO.
21	I COME AT THIS REALLY FROM THE STANDPOINT
22	OF HAVING BEEN SOMEWHAT SURPRISED BY THE CRISIS
23	SITUATION THAT SEEMS TO EXIST AT A STAFF LEVEL AND
24	THE FACT THAT THE STAFF SEEM TO BE A LITTLE BIT
25	CHALLENGED FROM A MORALE STANDPOINT WITH THE

1	PREVIOUS LEADERSHIP UNDER MARIA.
2	AND SO THE WAY I APPROACH THIS WAS TO
3	THINK HOW CAN WE DEAL WITH WHAT SEEMS TO ME TO BE,
4	IF I READ IT CORRECTLY, HEARD IT CORRECTLY, RIGHT
5	NOW A BIT OF I GUESS I'LL CALL IT A CRISIS FROM A
6	STAFF LEVEL.
7	AND SO I WOULD AGREE WITH WHAT STEVE SAID,
8	THAT THERE'S ONE BIG ISSUE THAT NEEDS TO BE DEALT
9	WITH NOW AND THAT'S TO GET THE BUDGET DONE.
10	I WOULD SAY THAT I THINK THE LEADERSHIP
11	THAT VITO AND MARIA PROVIDE COULD CARRY US VERY WELL
12	FOR SIX MONTHS ON THE OUTSIDE. BUT I DO THINK WE
13	NEED SOMEONE WHO CAN COME IN AND MANAGE WHAT I
14	BELIEVE AND INTERPRET TO BE A CRISIS SITUATION AND
15	WORK TO BUILD A LITTLE BIT MORE UNITY, I THINK, ON
16	THE STAFF IN PREPARATION FOR THE NEXT LEADER OF
17	CIRM.
18	SO MY THINKING ON THIS WAS THAT IT WOULD
19	BE APPROPRIATE TO TRY TO FIND SOMEONE WHO
20	UNDERSTANDS THE ORGANIZATION WELL AND HAS WORKED
21	WITH THE ORGANIZATION AND CAN DEAL WITH THIS ISSUE.
22	AND I THINK, STEVE'S POINT, TO WORK WITH THE TEAM ON
23	THE BUDGET AS WELL, NOT AN INTERIM CEO WHO IS AN ALL
24	ENCOMPASSING CEO. AND MAYBE IT DOESN'T NEED TO BE
25	SOMEONE WHO WE CALL A CEO, BUT I THINK SOMEONE NEEDS

1	TO BE AT THE HELM.
2	CHAIRMAN IMBASCIANI: THANK YOU, JOE.
3	MARK FOLLOWED BY JUDY GASSON AND LINDA MALKAS.
4	THANK YOU.
5	DR. FISCHER-COLBRIE: I THINK SOMEBODY HAS
6	BE AT THE HELM. I THINK THAT'S A VERY IMPORTANT
7	CONSIDERATION. THERE'S A LOT OF MOVING PARTS OF
8	ACTIVITIES THAT ARE COMING UP. AND AS ALWAYS, WE
9	CONTINUE TO BE AN IMPORTANT JUNCTURE RELATED TO
10	PRIORITIZATION AROUND PORTFOLIO, BUDGETARY ACTIVITY.
11	THERE ARE THE ONGOING CONTINUING EFFORTS OF
12	REESTABLISHING HOW WE INTERACT INTERNALLY FROM A
13	STAFFING PERSPECTIVE, IN TERMS OF READJUSTING TO
14	POST-COVID LIFE. SO SOMEBODY'S GOT TO BE IN CHARGE.
15	I THINK THAT IT'S INCUMBENT TO GET SOMEBODY TO FILL
16	THAT ROLE.
17	OBVIOUSLY THAT PERSON IS GOING TO BE
18	SUPPORTED BY THE VERY TALENTED CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR
19	AND OTHER MEMBERS OF THE BOARD FOR OTHER PURPOSES
20	AND EXTERNAL ACTIVITIES, BUT I THINK SOMEBODY HAS
21	GOT TO BE HELPING TO MAKE ALLOCATION DECISIONS,
22	ADJUDICATION DECISIONS, AND PROVIDING LEADERSHIP IN
23	THE CONTEXT THAT THE CURRENT STAFF ALREADY IS
24	EXTREMELY FULL WITH THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES, AND TO
25	HAVE A CENTRAL NODE FOR DECISION-MAKING WILL BE VERY

1	IMPORTANT.
2	CHAIRMAN IMBASCIANI: THANK YOU, MARK.
3	IT'S JUDY GASSON FOLLOWED BY LINDA MALKAS AND
4	ANNE-MARIE DULIEGE.
5	DR. GASSON: THANK YOU, VITO. I'M
6	SPEAKING ON BEHALF OF PAT LEVITT AND I, WHO ARE
7	CO-CHAIRS OF THE GOVERNANCE SUBCOMMITTEE. PAT'S IN
8	MEXICO TODAY OPENING UP A NEW PEDIATRIC CLINIC THAT
9	HE'S BEEN WORKING ON FOR THREE YEARS. BUT WE
10	DISCUSSED THIS EXTENSIVELY OVER THE WEEKEND. AND
11	WHAT PAT WOULD LIKE TO SAY IS WHATEVER IT IS THAT I
12	SAY HE WOULD HAVE SAID IT STRONGER.
13	SO THE FIRST POINT AND WE HAVEN'T MET
14	WITH THE COMMITTEE. THIS IS JUST PAT AND I AS THE
15	CO-CHAIRS. SO THE FIRST POINT I WOULD MAKE IS THAT
16	WE REALLY RECENTLY JUST APPOINTED A CHAIR AND A VICE
17	CHAIR OF THE BOARD AT 100 PERCENT EFFORT. SO
18	PRESUMABLY WE HAVE OUTLINED ENOUGH DUTIES TO KEEP
19	THEM BUSY FULL TIME.
20	I AGREE WITH THE PREVIOUS THREE SPEAKERS,
21	THAT THERE'S A NUMBER OF POLICIES AND PROCEDURES
22	THAT REALLY NEED REVIEW AND POTENTIALLY
23	RESTRUCTURING. AND I WOULD PARTICULARLY CALL OUT
24	THE HR ISSUES THAT HAVE BEEN ALLUDED TO.
25	THE BOARD HAS EXPRESSED A DESIRE FOR

1	PRIORITIZATION OF SCIENTIFIC OPPORTUNITIES GOING
2	FORWARD. AND IT WOULD BE GREAT TO HAVE THE
3	LEADERSHIP TEAM AND AN ACTING CEO PARTICIPATE FULLY
4	IN THOSE DISCUSSIONS THAT WILL BE LED BY THE SCIENCE
5	SUBCOMMITTEE.
6	AND AS WAS PREVIOUSLY SAID, I THINK WE DO
7	NEED TO PROVIDE SUPPORT AND LEADERSHIP TO THE VERY
8	STRONG TEAM THAT WE HAVE IN PLACE, ALSO WORKING WITH
9	THAT LEADERSHIP TEAM AND THE BOARD, TOGETHER TO
10	CONTINUE TO MOVE THIS ORGANIZATION FORWARD.
11	AND FINALLY, MY LAST POINT IS THAT WE'RE
12	GOING TO AT SOME POINT HAVE A NEW CEO AND PRESIDENT.
13	I HOPE IT'S IN SIX MONTHS. THERE'S NO WAY TO KNOW
14	FOR SURE WHETHER IT WILL BE IN SIX MONTHS. BUT
15	WE'RE GOING TO NEED TO PROVIDE A VERY STRONG HANDOFF
16	TO THAT NEW PERSON. I THINK HAVING AN INTERIM
17	PERSON IN THE POSITION THAT CAN ENABLE THAT STRONG
18	HANDOFF TO THE NEW CEO AND THE NEW PRESIDENT IS
19	REALLY CRITICAL FOR US TO GET THE RIGHT LEADER.
20	THANK YOU.
21	CHAIRMAN IMBASCIANI: THANK YOU, JUDY, FOR
22	THOSE REMARKS. LINDA MALKAS PLEASE.
23	DR. MALKAS: HI. I WANT TO ECHO OR
24	TOTALLY AGREE WITH THE COMMENTS OF DEBORAH AND JOE
25	AND MARK AND JUDY AND IF I MISSED ANYBODY, I'M

1	SORRY BUT I TOTALLY AGREE WITH THEM. I JUST WANT
2	TO ADD THAT I THINK IT'S REALLY IMPORTANT FOR THIS
3	AGENCY, THIS IS AN AGENCY, THAT THERE IS A CLEAR
4	SEPARATION BETWEEN THE ROLES OF THE PRESIDENT AND
5	CEO IN TERMS OF THEY'RE LOGISTICS, THEY'RE THE
6	OPERATIONAL PIECE.
7	WE ARE AND YOU, VITO, AND MARIA, NOT THAT
8	YOU WOULDN'T BE WONDERFUL, BUT YOU ARE OVERSIGHT,
9	AND THOSE ARE VERY, VERY SEPARATE ROLES. AND I LIKE
10	WHAT DEBORAH SAID. IF WE CAN DO SIX MONTHS OR A
11	YEAR WITHOUT A PRESIDENT AND CEO, WHY WOULD YOU HAVE
12	THEM? AND ALSO YOU HAVE A VERY, VERY FULL PLATE,
13	I'LL BE VERY HONEST, OF THINGS THAT YOU AND MARIA
14	ARE CHARGED WITH IN THIS VERY, AS I'M ECHOING
15	BEFORE, A VERY, VERY FULL MENU OF THINGS THAT YOU
16	HAVE TO TAKE CARE OF.
17	SO I WOULD ARGUE THAT WE DO NEED A
18	SEPARATE AN INDIVIDUAL THAT WOULD BE CHARGED WITH
19	CARRYING OUT THE LOGISTICS AND THE FUNCTION OF CIRM
20	AND THAT WE MAINTAIN OUR ROLE AS OVERSIGHT. AND
21	ALSO THIS PERSON WOULD BE NEEDED TO ACTUALLY HELP
22	CLEAN UP SOME OF THE TROUBLES THAT HAVE BEEN VOICED
23	BEFORE. THANK YOU.
24	CHAIRMAN IMBASCIANI: THANK YOU SO MUCH.
25	I HAVE TWO HANDS RAISED, ANNE-MARIE DULIEGE FOLLOWED

1	BY STEVE JUELSGAARD.
2	DR. DULIEGE: I AGREE WITH THE COMMENTS
3	THAT HAVE BEEN MADE. IN ADDITION, I ALSO BELIEVE
4	THAT WHILE WE SAY IT'S GOING TO TAKE ABOUT SIX
5	MONTHS, OR I THINK SAY A MINIMUM OF SIX MONTHS
6	REALISTICALLY. AND WE ALL HAVE SEEN HIRINGS OF THAT
7	CRITICAL NATURE TAKING MORE THAN THAT, USUALLY UP TO
8	12 MONTHS. AND THEN THERE WILL BE ALSO THE HANDOFF
9	AS WELL. SO I THINK IT WILL VERY LIKELY EXCEED SIX
10	MONTHS IN AN INTERIM ROLE AND MAY LIKELY SPILL OVER
11	THE ENTIRE NEXT YEAR VERY LIKELY.
12	THE SECOND THING IS I'M SURE I'M PREACHING
13	TO THIS CHOIR, BUT HOPEFULLY WE WILL FIND AN INTERIM
14	CEO WHO KNOWS CIRM VERY WELL, WHO KNOWS SACRAMENTO
15	VERY WELL SO THAT THE LEARNING CURVE ON THAT ROLE IS
16	MINIMAL. THAT'S IT FOR ME.
17	CHAIRMAN IMBASCIANI: THANK YOU VERY MUCH.
18	STEVE, BACK TO YOU.
19	MR. JUELSGAARD: YES. I THINK WHAT WE
20	HAVE IS A DIFFERENCE OF OPINION IN THE ROLE OF AN
21	INTERIM PRESIDENT. SO FOR ME, AND THIS IS THE CASE
22	IN MY EXPERIENCE, AN INTERIM PRESIDENT IS SOMEBODY
23	WHO JUST KEEPS THE HAND ON THE TILLER AND THE SHIP
24	RUNNING STEADY AND DOESN'T LAUNCH OFF IN A BUNCH OF
25	NEW DIRECTIONS. YOU REALLY WANT TO WAIT FOR THE NEW

1	CEO TO COME ON BOARD BEFORE YOU DO THINGS LIKE THAT.
2	SO, FOR EXAMPLE, I THINK MARK REMINISCED OR TALKED
3	ABOUT THE NOTION OF REPRIORITIZATION. I WOULD NOT
4	TOUCH THAT AT ALL UNTIL WE HAVE SOMEBODY NEW ON
5	BOARD.
6	IF THERE ARE MAJOR DECISIONS THAT NEED TO
7	GET MADE, WE NEED TO DO THAT WHEN WE HAVE THE KIND
8	OF PERSON LEADING THIS ORGANIZATION ON BOARD, NOT
9	BEFORE THEN. MY VIEW OF THE ROLE OF AN INTERIM
10	PRESIDENT IS JUST TO KIND OF KEEP THE THINGS RUNNING
11	THE WAY THEY ARE WITHOUT DOING TOO MUCH NEW. AND
12	THAT'S WHY I BASICALLY SAID THAT I THINK THAT FOR ME
13	THE MAJOR THING IS JUST THE BUDGET EXERCISE. BUT
14	THE NEURO TASK FORCE, ANYTHING THAT COMES OUT OF
15	THERE, I WOULD WAIT TILL THE NEW CEO COMES ABOARD.
16	PRIORITIZATION, I WOULD WAIT. I WOULD WAIT FOR ANY
17	MAJOR INITIATIVE UNTIL SOMEBODY NEW IS ON BOARD SO
18	THAT THEY CAN HELP LEAD HOW WE THINK ABOUT THOSE
19	EFFORTS.
20	CHAIRMAN IMBASCIANI: THANK YOU VERY MUCH.
21	I HAVE TWO NEW HANDS UP NOW, LEONDRA CLARK-HARVEY
22	FOLLOWED BY FRED FISHER.
23	DR. CLARK-HARVEY: THANK YOU SO MUCH. AND
24	I WANT TO ECHO $1,000$ PERCENT WHAT STEVE JUST SHARED.
25	THAT IS MY TAKE AS WELL ON WHAT WOULD BE MOST KIND

1	OF APPROPRIATE, SOMEONE TO JUST KIND OF RIGHT THE
2	SHIP. I THINK WE HAVE GREAT CONFIDENCE IN EXISTING
3	SENIOR LEVEL STAFF THAT WOULD BE ABLE TO DO THAT.
4	IN ADDITION, THEY HAVE GOOD RELATIONSHIPS
5	WITH THE STAFF, SOME OF WHOM WERE POTENTIALLY
6	DISGRUNTLED OR UNHAPPY. SO I DO HAVE CONFIDENCE
7	THAT THAT WOULD BE OKAY.
8	ALSO THE TIMING OF THIS. WE ARE UPON THE
9	HOLIDAYS. SO THERE'S GOING TO BE A LULL ANYWAYS IN
10	ENGAGEMENT AND FOLKS WILL BE ON VACATION. SO I
11	THINK THAT THAT WILL ALLOW US A LITTLE BIT OF TIME
12	TO GET TOGETHER AND DISCUSS THIS IN MORE DEPTH. IT
13	WILL ALLOW THE STAFF TO HAVE A BIT OF A BREAK,
14	CONTINUED BREAK, AND THEN TO COME BACK. THAT IS HOW

19	DR. FISHER: SO I'M HAPPY TO WELCOME
20	LEONDRA TO THE FRED, STEVE, AND LEONDRA PARTY. I
21	THINK STEVE HAS MAPPED IT OUT REALLY WELL.
22	THE FIRST THING I THOUGHT ABOUT IN TALKING
23	ABOUT AN INTERIM CEO IN THIS KIND OF ORGANIZATION IS
24	THEY'RE BASICALLY GOING TO BE A LAME DUCK. THEY'RE
25	NOT GOING TO LAUNCH ANY NEW, BIG INITIATIVES.

1	THEY'RE GOING TO KEEP THEIR HAND ON THE TILLER, BE
2	SOMEONE THAT PEOPLE CAN GO TO. AND SHOULD IT BE
3	THAT PERSON WHO IS VERY FAMILIAR WITH CIRM, WHOEVER
4	THAT MIGHT BE, THEY'RE GOING TO LEAN HEAVILY ON THE
5	STAFF ANYWAY TO INFORM THINKING ABOUT ANY DECISIONS
6	THAT WOULD BE MAJOR. AND, FRANKLY, ANY DECISIONS
7	THAT WOULD BE MAJOR WOULD LIKELY COME BACK TO THE
8	BOARD ANYWAY. AND AN INTERIM CEO IS NOT GOING TO
9	HAVE ENOUGH BACKGROUND INFORMATION TO MEANINGFULLY
10	INFORM THOSE DECISIONS ANYWAY WITHOUT THE INPUT OF
11	THE STAFF.
12	SO I THINK THE MESSAGE TO CALIFORNIANS IS
13	WE ARE BEING EFFICIENT WITH THEIR MONEY, AND WE DO
14	NOT CONFUSE THE ROLE OF AN INTERIM CEO WITH THE
15	PERMANENT PRESIDENT AND CEO BECAUSE A PERMANENT
16	PRESIDENT AND CEO IS NECESSARY, BUT TO SPEND THE
17	MONEY ON AN INTERIM DOESN'T SEEM LIKE THE MOST
18	PRODUCTIVE USE OF TAXPAYER DOLLARS. AND, FRANKLY,
19	THAT'S A MESSAGE THAT MIGHT BE HELPFUL TO US. THE
20	END.
21	CHAIRMAN IMBASCIANI: OKAY. I SEE A
22	COUPLE OF MORE HANDS UP. SO IT'S GOING TO BE NOW
23	DEBORAH DEAS FOLLOWED BY GEORGE BLUMENTHAL.
24	DR. DEAS: SO I SEE THE ROLE AS THE
25	INTERIM DIFFERENTLY AS WELL. AND I DON'T BELIEVE

1	THAT A PERSON WHO SERVES IN THE INTERIM ROLE IS SORT
2	OF A PLACEHOLDER BECAUSE THINGS DEVELOP WITHIN
3	ORGANIZATIONS THAT WE MAY NOT HAVE ANTICIPATED. AND
4	WE NEED SOMEONE TO BE ABLE TO DEAL WITH THOSE
