



CIRM has invested more than \$65 million in research to improve treatment options for people with Sickle Cell, including co-funding two clinical trials seeking different gene therapy approaches.

CIRM funded research is needed to reduce the patient's burden of treatment and make Sickle Cell therapies more accessible.
