CIRM has funded 103 clinical trials to date, over half are still active

200 patients were enrolled in CIRM funded trials in FY2022-2023

Treatment sites report 30-50% of patients require support services





Patent Royalties and License Revenues Paid to the State of California

All royalty revenues received through the intellectual property agreements shall be deposited into an interest-bearing account in the General Fund, ... for the purpose of offsetting the costs of providing treatments and cures arising from institute-funded research to California patients who have insufficient means to purchase such treatment or cure, including the reimbursement of patient-qualified costs for research participants.



Identified barriers to clinical trial participation:



- Patients or providers do not know a trial may exist for the patient's condition
- Patient may not know how to connect to trial site
- Consent, screening, enrollment, and follow up can require multiple steps or visits; coordination can increase successful enrollment

- Travel expenses, meals, accommodations, childcare and other out of pocket expenses ("patientqualified costs") can fall on patients
- Financial needs of underserved population tend to be more significant as they are less likely to be able to assume costs (even if they are reimbursable)





Overall program financing is supported by two distinct sources:

CIRM grant to PSP awardee

- Supported by CIRM program budget only
- Funds are for program design and planning, operational expenses

Patient Support Program (PSP) \$2.5M Patient Assistance Fund (PAF) \$15.6M

Funds to directly cover patient costs

- Serves eligible participants in CIRMfunded trials
- Dedicated to patientqualified costs
- Fund may be supplemented by future CIRM royalty streams

CIRM The PSP Program is Structured to Address Barriers



This program will address the financial and logistical bottlenecks often experienced by patients and their family members enrolling in or participating in CIRM-funded cell and gene therapy trials.

PSP Awardee will coordinate with CIRM on the program activities described below.



- Maintain a Patient Support Center to direct patients to clinical trials
- Coordinate with sponsors to verify authorization of participation
- Determine if patient is eligible for financial support



- Manage referrals
- Coordinate visits on behalf of patients

FINANCIAL	

- Administer PAF funds to cover travel expenses, meals, accommodations, childcare and other out of pocket expenses
- Develop accounting system to facilitate disbursements reporting to CIRM and to ensure non-duplication of costs or expenses





The INFR7 Awardee will implement the Patient Support Program as part of a three-stage project plan



Startup

- Program planning
- Development of operational systems
- Establishment of business rules, SOPs and process flows
- Testing of program services with Alpha Clinics



Phase 1 Implementation

- Launch of Patient
 Support Program
- Metrics and gapanalysis reporting to CIRM
- Reporting program performance to AAWG



Phase 2 Expansion

 Expansion of patient financial and logistical support services based on guidance from CIRM and AAWG





Who Can Apply?

- For-profit and not-for-profit organizations with at least 5 years of experience in patient support programs
- Applicant must be able to initiate services within 120 days of the final contract.
- Applicant must have a California location
- Applicant must provide evidence of adhering to best practices for patient support programs















INFR Scoring System



Score of "1"

Exceptional merit and warrants funding.

May have minor recommendations and adjustments that do not require further review by the AAWG

Score of "2"

Needs improvement and does not warrant funding at this time but, at the applicant's option, may be resubmitted to address areas for improvement if the Application Review Subcommittee has not approved an application for funding following the Working Group's review.

AAWG should provide recommendations that are achievable (i.e., "fixable changes") <u>or</u> request clarification/information on key concerns.

Score of "3"

Sufficiently flawed that it does not warrant funding.

Applications are scored by <u>all members of the AAWG</u> with no conflict.



Review Criteria Basis for Score



- 1. Does the application offer a meaningful value proposition to improve access and retention to CIRM-funded clinical trials through its proposed patient support services?
- 2. Is the project well planned and designed?
- **3**. Is the project feasible?
- 4. Does the project uphold principles of diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI)?





Scoring Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion – Prop 209

- While reviewers should feel free to evaluate almost any aspect of DEI you find pertinent, under CA's Prop 209 you must refrain from considering the race, ethnicity, national origin, or gender of <u>applicant team personnel</u>.
- If an applicant references these demographic characteristics in describing hiring efforts or current team members, please ignore these statements.
- Other characteristics of team members can be considered *if you feel they are pertinent* e.g., first to college, rural setting, adversity, disability...
