SUBJECT: ITEM #11: FINAL ADOPTION OF CIRM CONFLICT OF INTERST CODE AMENDMENTS

DATE: DECEMBER 3, 2012

Executive Summary

As required by the Political Reform Act, the Governing Board adopted a Conflict of Interest Code for CIRM in 2005. The Code describes the types of financial interests that members of the Governing Board and CIRM employees must disclose on their annual statements of economic interests (Form 700). CIRM, as with all state agencies, are required to update the Code on a biennial basis, which the ICOC directed staff to commence in May of this year. That process, overseen by the Office of Administrative Law ("OAL") and the Fair Political Practices Commission ("FPPC," which reviews CIRM's Code) was begun in May and has almost concluded. CIRM circulated the proposed changes for public comment and has received approval for the changes by the FPPC.¹ The proposed amendments are now ready for final adoption by the ICOC, after which the OAL will conduct a final review before going into effect. **Staff recommends adopting the proposed amendments.**

I. Background

As required by the Political Reform Act ("PRA"), the Governing Board adopted a Conflict of Interest Code for CIRM in 2005. The Code describes the types of financial interests that members of the Governing Board and CIRM employees must disclose on their annual statements of economic interests (Form 700).

The PRA also requires every state agency to review its conflict of interest code biennially to examine and amend the code to accurately reflect the current organization of the agency and to determine the appropriate level of disclosure of financial interests in light of the duties and responsibilities of the employees of the agency and the members of its governing board.

The FPPC, which enforces the PRA, is responsible for approving CIRM's Conflict of Interest Code, along with the codes of other agencies. In accordance with the process established by the FPPC for assisting agencies conduct this examination, counsel met with FPPC staff, who recommended that CIRM amend its code to eliminate the broadest disclosure category (which requires disclosure of financial interests in businesses and sources of income that do business or are

likely to do business in California) and instead require Board members and staff to make narrower disclosures of financial interests in businesses and sources of income that are of the type to provide goods or services to CIRM or to apply for CIRM funds and in biotech and pharmaceutical companies.

In May of this year, the Governance Subcommittee, upon recommendation of Chair Sherry Lansing, instead recommended to the Board that it maintain the broadest disclosure level for members of the Governing Board and executive staff and proceed only with the technical amendments to the Code, including reviewing the appropriate disclosure levels for non-executive staff. The Board concurred at its May 24, 2012, meeting and directed staff to propose amendments consistent with this direction.

The amendment process was begun pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act in June, and has involved FPPC staff advice on the levels of disclosure recommended for non-executive staff. The changes were circulated for public input and the process of review with the FPPC has concluded. The amendment process has concluded and the code is ready for final adoption by the ICOC.

II. Amendments to CIRM Conflict of Interest Code

In June of this year, staff commenced the regulatory process necessary to update CIRM's code. That process is overseen by the FPPC, which reviewed staff titles and job descriptions to determine the appropriate level of disclosure. The amendments were then circulated with interested persons and members of the public for further comment.

The proposed amendments comprise two documents: 1) Regulation 100000, Conflict of Interest Code; and 2) Appendices A and B. The amendments make minor technical amendments to Regulation 100000 and Appendix B (disclosure categories). With respect to Appendix A (designated positions), staff, working with the FPPC, has identified non-executive positions within the agency that should be subject to more carefully tailored disclosure levels. These revisions ensure that the disclosure categories are appropriate to the type of work performed by each position.

III. Recommendation

Staff recommends the Board adopt the proposed amendments.

*With respect shall disclose pursuant to consultants/new positions, the agency broadest disclosure category in the CIRM conflict of interest code, subject to the following limitations: The agency President may determine in writing that a particular consultant or new position, although a "designated position," employee, is hired to perform a range of duties that isare limited in scope and thus, is not required to comply fully with the disclosure requirements described in this section. Such determination shall include a description of the consultant's or new position seonsultant's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The agency President's determination of the President is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict—of—interest code. (GovernmentNothing herein excuses any such consultant from any other provision of this Conflict of Interest Code Section 81008.)-

Appendix B

Disclosure Categories

Category 1

An individual holding aA designated positionemployee in this category shall report any:

<u>Investments</u> All investments, business positions in business entities, and income (; including receipt of gifts, loans and travel payments); and all interests in real property located in the state of California, as defined in the Political Reform Act and the FPPC's regulations.

Category 2

<u>An individual holding aA designated positionemployee in this category</u> shall report <u>any</u>:

<u>Investments</u> All investments, business positions <u>in business entities</u> and income (; including <u>receipt of gifts</u>, loans and travel payments); if the business entity or source of income is of the type to receive grants or other monies from or through <u>CIRM</u>; the <u>California Institute for Regenerative Medicine</u>; and

<u>Investments All investments</u>, business positions <u>in business entities</u> and income (5 including <u>receipt of gifts</u>, loans and travel payments); if the business entity or the source of income is of the type to offer or provide facilities, services, goods or products purchased or used, or contracted for, by <u>CIRMthe California Institute for Regenerative Medicine</u>, and is providing or planning to provide such facilities, services, goods or products; and

<u>Investments All investments</u>, business positions <u>in business entities</u> and income (5 including <u>receipt of gifts</u>, loans and travel payments), if the business entity or source of income is engaged in biomedical research or manufacturing biomedical pharmaceuticals.

Category 3

An individual holding aA designated positionemployee in this category shall report any:

<u>Investments All investments</u>, business positions <u>in business entities</u> and income, (including <u>receipt of gifts</u>, loans and travel payments); if the business entity or source of income is engaged in biomedical research or manufacturing biomedical pharmaceuticals.

<u>Investments All investments</u>, business positions <u>in business entities</u> and income (5 including <u>receipt of gifts</u>, loans and travel payments) if the business entity or the source of income is of the type to offer or provide facilities, services, goods or products purchased or used, or contracted for, by <u>CIRMthe California Institute for Regenerative Medicine</u>, and is providing or is planning to provide such facilities, services, goods or products.

Category 4

An individual holding aA designated positionemployee in this category shall report any:

<u>Investments</u> All investments, business positions in business entities and income (5 including receipt of gifts, loans and travel payments) if the business entity or the source of income is of the type to offer or provide facilities, services, goods or products purchased or used, or contracted for, by <u>CIRMthe California Institute for Regenerative Medicine</u>, and is providing or is planning to provide such facilities, services, goods or products.
