Background

 The CIRM Board at its January meeting requested that a proposal for a possible supplement to current Bridges Training Program awardees be considered.

Problem

- Several of the existing Bridges Training Program awardees are reaching the end of their current 5-year award by June/July 2021
- In many cases, the recruitment and appointment activities required to establish the next year's trainee cohort begin 6 to 18 months ahead of the internship period.
- Despite the proposed issuance of an RFA, many existing awardees will experience an interruption where their next trainee cohort skips a year due to the timing of this new opportunity

Proposed Solution

- Provide a supplement to cover Program Administration costs from March through a new award start date in August of this year (5 months)
- The costs covered by the supplement must be necessary for program continuity in order to qualify <u>and</u> the current awardee must apply for a new Bridges award under the proposed RFA.
- If a supplement awardee is successful in earning a new Bridges Training Award, the new award amount will be reduced by the supplemented amount.
- If a supplement awardee is not successful, any remaining amount may be used for wind-down activities and award close out.

Supplement Allocation

- Maximum amount for each supplement award is \$50,000.
- Supplement may only be used for Program Administration costs directly attributed to and necessary for avoiding an interruption in appointing the next trainee cohort.
- Qualifying Bridges Training Program awardees must request a supplement by providing a detailed budget to CIRM that adequately justifies the proposed costs.
- CIRM proposes a total allocation of \$500,000 for approximately 10 supplement awards.
