STEM CELL RESEARCH, AND CALIFORNIA PATIENTS**

WHEREAS, Robert A. Quint received his Bachelor of Science majoring in biology from the University of Notre Dame;

WHEREAS, Dr. Quint received his Doctorate in Medicine from Ohio State University School of Medicine

WHEREAS, Dr. Quint completed his internship and residency at the University of Texas Medical Branch, John Sealy Hospital;

WHEREAS, Dr. Quint completed two fellowships, in internal medicine and invasive cardiology, at the Cleveland Clinic in Cleveland, Ohio;

WHEREAS, Dr. Quint began his history of public service in the military, working as a cardiologist and internist at the Valley Forge Hospital in Phoenixville, Pennsylvania;

WHEREAS, Dr. Quint served as a member of the U.S. Army Medical Corps, as an internist and cardiologist at the 8th Field Hospital in Nha Trang, Vietnam;

WHEREAS, Dr. Quint has specialized in cardiology since 1971;

WHEREAS, Dr. Quint has written articles for such publications as the American Journal of Cardiology and the Journal of Thoracic Cardiovascular Surgery;

WHEREAS, for fourteen years, Dr. Quint served as a clinical instructor on the voluntary clinical faculty at the Stanford University School of Medicine;

WHEREAS, Dr. Quint has presented and lectured on medicine in Iran, Sri Lanka, and Japan;

WHEREAS, Dr. Quint holds a staff appointment at the O'Connor Hospital in San Jose;

WHEREAS, over Dr. Quint's 25-year tenure at O'Connor Hospital, he has been Director of the Department of Cardiology and Vascular Services and a member of the Cardiovascular Quality Assurance Committee;

WHEREAS, Dr. Quint is a charter member and founding fellow of the Society for Cardiac Angiography and Interventions (SCAI) and the SCAI's Credentials Committee;

WHEREAS, Dr. Quint serves on the American Heart Association's (AHA) Scientific Council and AHA's Council on Atherosclerosis;

WHEREAS, Dr. Quint serves as a member of the Medical Advisory Board of the Scimed Lifesystems, Inc., the United States Congressional Advisory Board, and the American Professional Practice Association;


