18	DECEMBER.
19	WITH THAT, POUNEH SIMPSON WILL DO THE
20	PRESENTATION. AND, POUNEH, YOU MIGHT WANT TO TELL
21	EVERYONE WHAT YOUR POSITION IS WITH CIRM. I DON'T
22	KNOW IF EVERYONE KNOWS THE GREAT WORK THAT YOU'RE
23	DOING. THANK YOU.
24	MS. SIMPSON: GOOD AFTERNOON, CHAIR AND
25	MEMBERS. I'M POUNEH SIMPSON, THE DIRECTOR OF

1	FINANCE. AND IT'S MY PLEASURE TO BE PRESENTING TO
2	YOU THE MID-YEAR 21/22 BUDGET. SO I'M GOING TO PUT
3	THE PRESENTATION UP ON THE SCREEN AND GET STARTED
4	WITH THAT.
5	SO JUST AS AN OVERVIEW TO START THIS
6	PRESENTATION, I WANTED TO SHOW A CHART THAT
7	SUMMARIZES WHERE WE WERE AT BEFORE, WHAT THE
8	MID-YEAR BUDGET REPRESENTS, AND WHAT THE TOTAL WOULD
9	BE SHOULD YOU APPROVE THE REQUEST.
10	SO IN THE FIRST COLUMN, WE HAVE THE
11	CATEGORIES THAT WE TYPICALLY THE GENERAL
12	CATEGORIES WE REPORT EXPENSES FOR ADMINISTRATION.
13	THE SECOND COLUMN IS THE COLUMN THAT THE ICOC
14	APPROVED, THE \$21.1 MILLION THAT WAS APPROVED IN
15	JUNE OF 2021. AT THAT POINT IN TIME, WE WERE
16	WORKING ON A STRATEGIC PLAN, AND WE LET THE BOARD
17	KNOW THAT WE WOULD BE LOOKING AT A MID-YEAR REVISE,
18	ADJUSTMENT. AND SO THE THIRD COLUMN REPRESENTS THE
19	ADJUSTMENT THAT WE'RE PRESENTING TO YOU TODAY FOR
20	YOUR APPROVAL. AND, FINALLY, THE END RESULT WOULD
21	BE A TOTAL BUDGET OF \$23.4 MILLION SHOULD YOU
22	APPROVE IT.
23	SO IN THE NEXT FEW SLIDES, I WANT TO KIND
24	OF DO A SUMMARY OF WHERE WE WERE AT BEFORE AND WHERE
25	WE ARE GOING. IN OUR AGENDA I'LL REVIEW THE $21/22$

1	BUDGET JUST AS A RECAP AND THEN DIVE INTO THE
2	DETAILS AND THE MAJOR DRIVERS OF WHAT WE'RE ASKING
3	FOR AS PART OF THE MID-YEAR REVISE.
4	SO IN JULY IT'S A UNIQUE YEAR BECAUSE
5	IN JULY WE KNEW THAT THERE WOULD BE CHANGES COMING
6	WITH THE NEW STRATEGIC PLAN. SO THE JULY TO
7	DECEMBER BUDGET HAD FUNDS IN IT AND NEW POSITIONS TO
8	HELP US WITH THE RELAUNCH AFTER PROP 14 PASSED,
9	DEVELOPING A FIVE-YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN, AND FILLING
10	THE NINE VACANCIES THAT THE ICOC APPROVED, BASICALLY
11	INCREASING THE REVIEWS IN THE PILLARS, AND
12	INCREASING THE SCIENTIFIC ADVISORY AND STRATEGIC
13	PLANNING ACTIVITIES THE FIRST SIX MONTHS. AS A
14	RESULT OF THAT, WE HAVE A PROPOSED STRATEGIC PLAN
15	AND AN UPDATED REQUEST TO YOU.
16	SO DIVING INTO THAT UPDATED REQUEST,
17	AGAIN, YOU HAD APPROVED \$21.1 MILLION, AND WE ARE
18	ASKING FOR AN INCREASE OF \$2.3 MILLION IN THE
19	CATEGORIES THAT YOU SEE HERE FOR THE MID-YEAR
20	REVISE. I WANT TO DELVE INTO THOSE VARIANCES IN
21	DETAIL, ESPECIALLY THE MAJOR DRIVERS.
22	THERE WERE FIVE MAJOR DRIVERS, THREE
23	INCREASING OUR NEED TO COME TO YOU FOR A REQUEST AND
24	THEN TWO DECREASING OUR BUDGET. SO IN THE NEXT FEW
25	SLIDES, I WILL SEPARATE THOSE OUT AND GO INTO THEM.

THE LARGEST MAJOR DRIVER WE HAVE IS EMPLOYEE
EXPENSES. BASICALLY BECAUSE OF THE INCREASE IN
OPERATIONAL DEMANDS, THE PORTFOLIO SIZE, AND THE NEW
PROGRAMS, WE ARE REQUESTING AN INCREASE OF SIX
POSITIONS, TAKING OUR TOTAL POSITION NUMBER TO 55.
WE ARE ALSO ASKING FOR AN INCREASE FOR PATIENT
ADVOCATE PER DIEM TO BE CONSISTENT WITH THE PROP 14
REQUIREMENTS. AND SO THAT TOTALED \$1.4 MILLION,
ROUGHLY 10-PERCENT INCREASE FROM WHERE IT WAS
BEFORE.
THE SECOND MAJOR DRIVER IS INCREASED
EXTERNAL SERVICES. THERE'S TWO MAJOR THINGS DRIVING
THAT. ONE IS THAT DUE TO COVID WE WENT PAPERLESS.
WE'RE ALL WORKING REMOTELY AND USING DIGITAL FORMS
OF DOCUMENTATION, BUT WE STILL HAVE SOME PAPER FILES
THAT WE NEED TO SCAN FOR HISTORICAL PURPOSES FOR TWO
REASONS. ONE IS JUST TO KEEP THE RECORDS FOR LEGAL
REASONS FOR RECORDS RETENTION, AND THE SECOND IS SO
THAT WE CAN HAVE SOME SAVINGS WITH REGARDS TO THE
OFFICE MOVE SO WE'RE NOT MOVING FILES THAT COULD BE
SCANNED AND STORED DIGITALLY.
AND THEN THE SECOND DRIVER THERE IS THE
ADA COMPLIANCE. WE'RE TRYING TO MAKE SURE OUR WEB
SITE IS COMPLIANT WITH THE AMERICANS WITH
DISABILITIES ACT, AND THAT'S ROUGHLY 1 \$200,000

1	CONTRACT. IN TERMS OF SAVINGS IN THIS CATEGORY, WE
2	WERE ABLE TO CAPTURE SOME SAVINGS RELATED TO
3	DEVELOPING THE STRATEGIC PLAN AND OUR HR CONSULTING.
4	SO HERE WE'RE SHOWING BOTH WHERE WE NEED
5	INCREASES, WHERE WE NEED DECREASES FOR A NET OF
6	\$385,000 OR 18 PERCENT.
7	FINALLY, THE THIRD AREA THAT WE HAVE AN
8	INCREASE IN IS OFFICE EXPENSES. YOU DID APPROVE
9	SOME FUNDS FOR THE MOVE, BUT WE NOW HAVE SOME
10	UPDATED COSTS WHICH INCLUDE THE SOFTWARE UPGRADES,
11	EQUIPMENT REFRESH, SERVERS AND NETWORK FOR THE NEW
12	LOCATION, MEDIA ROOM, AUDIOVISUAL PLANNING, AND
13	MODIFICATIONS FOR THE NEW OFFICE. AND THAT IS
14	COMING TO ABOUT \$720,000. IT'S A SIGNIFICANT
15	INCREASE WITH REGARDS TO WHAT WAS THERE BEFORE; BUT
16	IN TERMS OF ALL THE ACTIVITIES THAT WE ARE DOING,
17	IT'S COMPETITIVELY BID AND AT A COST THAT'S
18	COMPARABLE.
19	SO THEN WE HAVE TWO MAJOR DRIVERS OF
20	DECREASED COST THAT WE ARE BRINGING TO YOU. WE HAVE
21	SOME SAVINGS RELATED TO TRAVEL BECAUSE SOME OF THE
22	MEETINGS THAT WE WERE PLANNING TO HAVE IN PERSON
23	WERE VIRTUAL, SOME OF THE TRAININGS WE WERE PLANNING
24	ON GOING TO DID NOT TAKE PLACE, AND SOME OF THE
25	CONFERENCE WE HAD PLANNED IN PERSON DID NOT TAKE

1	PLACE. SO AN ESTIMATED \$57,000 IN SAVINGS HERE THAT
2	WE ARE CAPTURING, AND THEN WE'RE ALSO CAPTURING SOME
3	SAVINGS WITH REGARDS TO REVIEWS, MEETINGS, AND
4	WORKSHOPS.
5	SPECIFICALLY ONE OF THE CLINICAL PROGRAM
6	REVIEWS WEREN'T VIRTUAL INSTEAD OF BEING IN PERSON.
7	WE HAD ASKED YOU FOR FUNDS TO HAVE IT IN PERSON, BUT
8	ENDED UP GOING VIRTUAL. AND THEN TWO OF OUR REVIEWS
9	WERE POSTPONED TO NEXT FISCAL YEAR, CAPTURING
10	\$154,000 IN SAVINGS.
11	AND SO JUST TO POINT OUT, THERE ARE SOME
12	RISK FACTORS THAT MAY IMPACT OUR ABILITY TO KIND OF
13	FORECAST WHAT'S COMING. ONE OF THEM BEING THE
14	OFFICE MOVE. ONE OF THEM BEING THE PERSONNEL GROWTH
15	AND RECRUITMENT OF NEW STAFF. AND, FINALLY, THE
16	UNKNOWNS RELATED TO COVID. HAVING SAID THAT, WE ARE
17	STAYING WITHIN OUR BUDGET AND MAINTAINING A CLOSE
18	LOOK ON OUR BUDGET TO MAKE SURE THAT WE DON'T EXCEED
19	OUR APPROVED BUDGET.
20	SO WITH THAT, I WOULD LIKE TO ASK FOR THE
21	SUBCOMMITTEE TO APPROVE OUR PROPOSED MID-YEAR BUDGET
22	AND WOULD BE HAPPY TO TAKE ANY QUESTIONS YOU MAY
23	HAVE.
24	CHAIRMAN ROWLETT: THANK YOU, POUNEH. AND
25	I'LL ASK MEMBERS OF THE FINANCE SUBCOMMITTEE IF THEY

1	HAVE QUESTIONS.
2	MR. JUELSGAARD: I'LL MOVE, AL.
3	DR. VUORI: SECOND. THIS IS KRISTINA.
4	CHAIRMAN ROWLETT: WE HAVE A MOTION AND A
5	SECOND. ARE THERE QUESTIONS FROM MEMBERS OF THE
6	COMMITTEE?
7	DR. VUORI: MAYBE I MISSED THIS, BUT WHAT
8	IS THE MOVE DATE TO THE NEW OFFICES?
9	DR. MILLAN: I CAN RESPOND TO THAT,
10	POUNEH. SO WE DON'T HAVE AN EXACT DATE, KRISTINA.
11	THE CURRENT LEASE EXPIRES AT THE END OF MARCH WITH
12	THE CURRENT BUILDING, WHICH IS A LEASE EXTENSION.
13	WE ARE TARGETING AROUND THAT TIME, THE LEASE IS
14	UNDER NEGOTIATION FOR THE NEW SPACE, AND WE ARE IN
15	THE PROCESS OF FIGURING OUT THE CONDITION OF THE NEW
16	SPACE. SO SOMETIME MID YEAR 2022.
17	MR. JUELSGAARD: MARIA, I HAVE SEVERAL
18	QUESTIONS WHENEVER YOU'RE READY.
19	CHAIRMAN ROWLETT: SURE.
20	MR. JUELSGAARD: I JUST WANT TO START
21	FIRST OF ALL WITH WHERE WE ARE WITH NINE POSITIONS
22	THAT WE APPROVED BACK LAST SUMMER. WE WERE GOING TO
23	HIRE NINE NEW PEOPLE. WE'RE GETTING CLOSE TO THE
24	END OF THE YEAR, NOT OF THE FISCAL YEAR, BUT OF THE
25	CALENDAR YEAR. HOW ARE WE COMING WITH RESPECT TO

1	HIRING THOSE NINE?
2	MS. SIMPSON: SO WE HAVE BEEN ACTIVELY
3	RECRUITING FOR POSITIONS. AND EVEN AS WE SPEAK,
4	THERE'S INTERVIEWS TAKING PLACE FOR SOME OF THE
5	POSITIONS THAT WERE APPROVED IN JUNE. OVERALL WE'RE
6	VERY CLOSE TO FILLING ALL OF THE NINE APPROVED.
7	MR. JUELSGAARD: OKAY. YOU EXPECT
8	THERE'S FEEDBACK COMING FROM SOMEWHERE OUT THERE.
9	IN ANY EVENT, THE SECOND QUESTION HAS TO DO WITH THE
10	FUNDING FOR THE SIX POSITIONS THAT ARE BEING
11	CREATED. SO YOU HAVE A FUNDING AMOUNT OF
12	\$1,016,000. I TAKE THAT, BECAUSE WE ARE TALKING
13	ABOUT A HALF-YEAR BUDGET APPROPRIATION, THAT THAT'S
14	FOR SIX MONTHS WORTH OF FUNDS, RIGHT? SO IF YOU
15	DIVIDE 1,016,000 BY SIX, IT'S 170,000. AND SO
16	THAT'S FOR A HALF YEAR OR \$340,000 FOR A FULL YEAR.
17	SO THAT'S SEEMS LIKE A LOT OF MONEY TO BE QUITE
18	HONEST. I'LL JUST PUT THAT ON THE TABLE. SO CAN
19	YOU EXPLAIN TO ME HOW WE GOT TO THAT KIND OF NUMBER?
20	MS. SIMPSON: SO I THINK A PORTION OF
21	THAT IS SOME OF THE CLASSIFICATIONS THAT WE ARE
22	HIRING ARE AT A HIGHER SALARY. SO THAT'S DRIVING
23	SOME OF IT. BUT WE ALSO ACCOUNT FOR SOME OF THE
24	ADDITIONAL BENEFITS THAT THEY'RE GETTING, AND WE DO
25	HAVE HIGHER PAYING SALARIES. SO IT DOES COME TO

1	ABOUT 250,000 PER EMPLOYEE.
2	MR. JUELSGAARD: SO THE SALARY IS 250,000
3	AND THEN THERE'S AN ADDITIONAL 90,000 IN BENEFITS.
4	IS THAT HOW THIS WORKS?
5	MS. SIMPSON: IT VARIES. SO DEPENDING ON
6	THE CLASSIFICATION, IT'S A DIFFERENT SALARY
7	OBVIOUSLY. SCIENTISTS ARE IN THE TWO HUNDREDS, AND
8	THEN THEY HAVE THE BENEFITS ADDED TO THEM. THE NINE
9	POSITIONS THAT WERE APPROVED DID HAVE A LARGE NUMBER
10	OF SCIENTIST CLASSIFICATIONS WHICH ARE AT THE HIGHER
11	SALARY LEVEL.
12	MR. JUELSGAARD: I'M FOCUSED ON THE SIX
13	THAT ARE PART OF YOUR PRESENTATION FOR ADDITIONAL
14	SLITS. I DON'T KNOW WHAT THE FACTS ARE. YOU'VE NOT
15	IDENTIFIED WHAT ROLE THEY PLAY. I'M JUST MAKING THE
16	OBSERVATION THAT 340,000 PER IS A LOT OF MONEY
17	RELATIVELY SPEAKING. SO THERE MUST BE SOME
18	RELATIVELY SENIOR POSITIONS, ALL SIX OF THEM, OR IS
19	THERE SOME OTHER EXPLANATION?
20	MS. SIMPSON: THEY ARE SCIENTISTS, WHICH
21	IS DRIVING THE HIGHER COST.
22	MR. JUELSGAARD: ALL SIX ARE?
23	MS. SIMPSON: YES. THERE'S ONE PROJECT
24	MANAGER, BUT THE REMAINDER ARE SCIENTISTS.
25	DR. MILLAN: ONE OF THEM IS THE PROPOSED

1	MEDICAL AFFAIRS POLICY LEAD THAT WILL BE A LEADER IN
2	CRAFTING THE STRATEGY FOR ACCESSIBILITY AND
3	AFFORDABILITY ALONG WITH THE ACCESSIBILITY AND
4	AFFORDABILITY WORKING GROUP. SO THAT IS DRIVING THE
5	OVERALL COST. THIS ESTIMATE IS DISTRIBUTED AMONG
6	THE FTE'S, BUT THAT PARTICULAR POSITION WOULD BE
7	EXPECTED TO BE A VERY SENIOR RECRUIT.
8	MR. JUELSGAARD: ALL RIGHT. SO WHAT'S
9	YOUR ANTICIPATED ON-BOARDING SCHEDULE LOOK LIKE FOR
10	THESE SIX POSITIONS? SO I JUST ASKED BY THE NINE,
11	AND YOU SAID YOU WERE CLOSE TO THE END OF THE ROAD
12	ON HIRING. SO IT TOOK BASICALLY SIX MONTHS TO GET
13	NINE PEOPLE HIRED. WHAT'S YOUR EXPECTATION FOR THE
14	ADDITIONAL PEOPLE?
15	MS. SIMPSON: I APOLOGIZE. THE NINE
16	POSITIONS HAVE MOSTLY BEEN FILLED. THESE SIX
17	POSITIONS ARE GOING WE ARE GOING TO START
18	RECRUITING AS SOON AS THE ICOC APPROVES THE BUDGET
19	IN MID-DECEMBER, ADVERTISING THE POSITIONS. AND
20	BASED ON THE LAST SET OF RECRUITMENTS WE HAD, WE
21	HAVE SOME GOOD CANDIDATES THAT WE CAN REACH OUT TO
22	THIS NEW SET OF HIRES. BUT WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO
23	FILL OUR VACANCIES.
24	MR. JUELSGAARD: I APPRECIATE THAT. MAYBE
25	YOU'RE NOT BUDGETING THIS LEVEL OF DETAIL. BUT I'M

1	USED TO SEEING BUDGETS AT LEAST IN OTHER
2	ORGANIZATIONS WHERE YOU BASICALLY BUDGET ACCORDING
3	TO POSITION OVER A PERIOD OF TIME. SO TWO IN THE
4	FIRST MONTH, ONE IN THE NEXT MONTH, DA-DA-TA-DA, BUT
5	I TAKE IT YOU HAVEN'T DONE THAT. THIS IS JUST
6	EVERYBODY IN AT THE BEGINNING OF JANUARY.
7	MS. SIMPSON: THAT'S CORRECT.
8	MR. JUELSGAARD: LASTLY, THIS IS THE SPACE
9	THAT WE'RE GOING TO BE MOVING TO, I TAKE IT, IN
10	SOUTH SAN FRANCISCO, IF I REMEMBER RIGHT. IS THERE
11	ROOM FOR IN-PERSON BOARD MEETINGS AT THAT NEW
12	FACILITY?
13	MS. SIMPSON: THERE IS.
14	MR. JUELSGAARD: OKAY. THAT'S ALL THE
15	QUESTIONS I HAVE, CHAIRMAN ROWLETT.
16	CHAIRMAN ROWLETT: THANKS, STEVE.
17	AND, MARIA OR POUNEH, AGAIN, COULD YOU
18	REPEAT THOSE SIX THE TITLES OF THE SIX POSITIONS?
19	THERE WAS ONE POSITION IN PARTICULAR. THERE ARE
20	FIVE SCIENTISTS AND THERE WAS ONE OTHER POSITION.
21	IF YOU COULD REPEAT THE TITLE FOR THAT POSITION.
22	MS. SIMPSON: I WILL BE HAPPY TO. JUST
23	GIVE ME A SECOND TO PULL THAT UP.
24	CHAIRMAN ROWLETT: WHILE SHE'S PULLING
25	THAT UP, IF THE COMMITTEE MEMBERS HAVE ANY OTHER

1	QUESTIONS.
2	DR. MELMED: ACTUALLY I DO, AL. FOLLOWING
3	ON JUELL'S QUESTION, I DIDN'T UNDERSTAND THE
4	TIMELINE EITHER. IF YOUR ARE ONLY ADVERTISING IN
5	JANUARY, WHY ARE WE BUDGETING SIX MONTHS ONLY
6	SALARY?
7	MS. SIMPSON: TYPICALLY DEPARTMENTS
8	ANTICIPATE RECRUITMENT IN JANUARY AND ASK FOR
9	FUNDING STARTING JANUARY BECAUSE IT CAN BE A SHORT
10	RECRUITMENT PERIOD IN THE EVENT THAT WE HAVE
11	CANDIDATES THAT APPLY RIGHT AWAY AND ARE A GOOD FIT.
12	WHEN WE HAVE DELAYS IN HIRING, WE CAPTURE
13	THOSE SAVINGS AND WE REPORT THEM AT THE END OF THE
14	YEAR. SO WE ALWAYS ASK FOR THE FULL AMOUNT OF WHAT
15	WE'RE GOING TO NEED SHOULD WE HIRE ON TIME AND THEN
16	RETURN THE SAVINGS AT THE END OF THE YEAR.
17	DR. STAMOS: YOU'RE ASKING FOR UP TO 1.016
18	THEN FOR THE PERSONNEL? THANK YOU.
19	MR. ROWLETT: THAT'S CORRECT. OTHER
20	QUESTIONS?
