4	THEN I WILL CALL THE MEETING OF THE INTELLECTUAL
5	PROPERTY AND INDUSTRY SUBCOMMITTEE MEETING TO ORDER.
6	OUR FIRST ITEM OF BUSINESS IS THE ROLL CALL. SO,
7	MARIA, IF YOU WOULD PROCEED WITH THAT, PLEASE.
8	MS. BONNEVILLE: STEVE JUELSGAARD.
9	CHAIRMAN JUELSGAARD: HERE.
10	MS. BONNEVILLE: OS STEWARD. JONATHAN
11	THOMAS.
12	CHAIRMAN THOMAS: HERE.
13	MS. BONNEVILLE: JEFF SHEEHY.
14	MR. SHEEHY: HERE.
15	MS. BONNEVILLE: JOE PANETTA. ANNE-MARIE

23	CHAIRMAN JUELSGAARD: OKAY. GREAT. SO WE
24	HAVE ONLY ONE ITEM OF BUSINESS TO CONSIDER TODAY.
25	THE OTHER ITEM OF BUSINESS THAT WAS ORIGINALLY TO BE
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1	PART OF THIS HAS BEEN POSTPONED FOR FURTHER WORK.
2	BUT THE ITEM OF BUSINESS REGARDS AN AMENDMENT OF THE
3	LOAN ADMINISTRATION POLICY. IS SCOTT THERE, MARIA?
4	MS. BONNEVILLE: HE SURE IS.
5	CHAIRMAN JUELSGAARD: HI, SCOTT. SO,
6	SCOTT, SINCE YOU'RE THE AUTHOR OF THIS PROPOSED
7	CHANGE, I'M GOING TO TURN THE MEETING OVER TO YOU SO
8	YOU CAN TAKE US THROUGH WHAT THE PROPOSAL IS PLEASE.
9	MR. TOCHER: OKAY. GREAT. THANKS VERY
10	MUCH.
11	SO AS YOU'RE PROBABLY AWARE, THE CIRM TEAM
12	IS REVIEWING THE ENTIRETY OF CIRM POLICIES BOTH
13	EXTERNAL AND INTERNAL TO IDENTIFY THE EFFICIENCIES
14	AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR IMPROVEMENT OR TO ADDRESS THE
15	CONCERNS OF OUR GRANTEES AND MEMBERS OF THE
16	REGULATED COMMUNITY.
17	TO THAT END AND TO THE ITEM THAT STEVE
18	MENTIONED THAT IS CURRENTLY POSTPONED, WE'VE
19	IDENTIFIED MEASURES THAT WE WOULD CONSIDER IN HOW WE
20	IMPLEMENT OUR LOAN PROGRAM IN THE CONTEXT OF THESE
21	NEW CIRM 2.0 PROGRAMS. SO THAT WILL BE A FUTURE
22	ITEM FOR THE COMMITTEE.
23	HOWEVER, WE HAVE IDENTIFIED AN ITEM WITH
24	RESPECT TO OUR EXISTING LOAN PROGRAM AND OUR
25	EXISTING LOAN RECIPIENTS. AND THE CHANGE THAT WE
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1	HAVE BEFORE YOU TODAY IS TO ADDRESS A POTENTIAL
2	CONCERN THAT HAS ARISEN FOR OUR GRANTEES, BUT ALSO
3	HAS IMPLICATIONS FOR CIRM IN THE FUTURE AS WELL.
4	SO AS THE MEMO DESCRIBES, THE CURRENT LOAN
5	PROGRAM IS BASICALLY CONFIGURED IN TWO WAYS SUCH
6	THAT A LOAN RECIPIENT IS EITHER OBLIGATED TO REPAY
7	THE LOAN REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE CIRM-FUNDED
8	PROJECT IS SUCCESSFUL OR, CONVERSELY, THAT THE LOAN
9	RECIPIENT IS OBLIGATED TO REPAY ONLY IF THE PROGRAM
10	IS SUCCESSFUL. AND IT'S IN THE CONTEXT OF THAT
11	SECOND OPTION, WHICH IS CALLED A PRODUCT-BACKED
12	LOAN, THAT THIS PROPOSED CHANGE EXISTS.
13	WHAT WE HAVE HEARD BACK FROM AT LEAST ONE
14	OF OUR LOAN RECIPIENTS IS THAT EVEN IN THE EVENT
15	THAT THEIR LOAN IS FORGIVEN BY CIRM, BECAUSE OF THE
16	NATURE OF THE WAY THE LOAN MAY SPRING BACK INTO
17	OBLIGATION IF FUTURE REVENUES ARE RECEIVED ON THE
18	CIRM PROJECT, THIS PRESENTS A CHALLENGE AS TO HOW
19	THESE COMPANIES CARRY THIS LOAN ON THEIR BOOKS AND
20	FOR HOW LONG. SO WHAT WE'VE PROPOSED, TO PROVIDE
21	CLARITY WITH REGARD TO THESE OBLIGATIONS, IS TO
22	PROVIDE THE OPTION FOR LOAN RECIPIENTS WHO HAVE A
23	PRODUCT-BACKED LOAN THAT IS FORGIVEN TO, INSTEAD,
24	CONVERT THAT LOAN TO HAVE IT BE TREATED AS A GRANT.
25	AND THEIR GRANT, THEREFORE, WOULD BE SUBJECT TO ALL
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1	OF THE USUAL FINANCIAL REVENUE SHARING PROVISIONS
2	THAT APPLY TO ANY TRADITIONAL GRANT.
3	AND SO WE'VE SPOKEN TO A FEW INTERESTED
4	PARTIES ABOUT THIS, OR AT LEAST ONE, AND WHAT WE
5	WOULD PROPOSE IS TO INITIATE A REGULATORY PROCEEDING
6	TO CIRCULATE THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT FOR PUBLIC
7	COMMENT, BRING IT BACK TO THE SUBCOMMITTEE AND THE
8	BOARD FOR FINAL CONSIDERATION, AND BEGIN THAT
9	PROCESS AFTER THE NEXT BOARD MEETING. AND IF YOU
10	HAVE ANY QUESTIONS, I'D BE HAPPY TO DISCUSS THEM.
11	CHAIRMAN JUELSGAARD: SCOTT, THIS IS
12	STEVE. HOW MANY LOANS HAVE WE FORGIVEN TO DATE FOR
13	WHICH THIS PRESENTS AN ISSUE TO THE PARTY THAT TOOK
14	OUT THE LOAN?
15	MR. TOCHER: RIGHT. THERE ARE TWO LOANS
16	CURRENTLY THAT ARE FORGIVEN THAT ARE PRODUCT-BACKED
17	LOANS THAT WOULD BE ELIGIBLE UNDER THIS PROGRAM.
18	CHAIRMAN JUELSGAARD: AND NECK OF BOTH
19	PARTIES, THEY SEE THIS AS A PROBLEM?
20	MR. TOCHER: I KNOW THAT I CAN SPEAK TO AT
21	LEAST ONE OF THEM HAS.
22	CHAIRMAN JUELSGAARD: OKAY. WE HAVEN'T
23	CONTACTED THE OTHER ONE TO SEE IF THIS PRESENTED A
24	SIMILAR PROBLEM FOR THEM.
25	MR. TOCHER: CORRECT. I HAVEN'T SPOKEN
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1	WITH THEM. THAT WOULD BE PART OF OUR REGULATORY
2	PROCESS OF SEEKING PUBLIC COMMENT FROM THEIR PARTY.
3	CHAIRMAN JUELSGAARD: ALL RIGHT. WE HAVE
4	NO REASON TO DISBELIEVE WHAT THEY'RE TELLING US,
5	THAT THEY BASICALLY HAVE TO RETAIN THIS LOAN ON
6	THEIR BALANCE SHEET AS A POTENTIAL LIABILITY?
7	MR. TOCHER: THAT'S RIGHT.
8	CHAIRMAN JUELSGAARD: WE HAVEN'T
9	INDEPENDENTLY CONFIRMED THAT WITH ANY ACCOUNTING OR
10	HAVE WE?
11	MR. HARRISON: WE HAVEN'T SPOKEN TO THE
12	ACCOUNTANTS, BUT I HAVE IN CONTACT WITH THE GENERAL
13	COUNSEL OF ONE OF OUR LOAN RECIPIENTS WHO DID MAKE
14	THE REPRESENTATION THAT THEIR ACCOUNTANTS HAD
15	ADVISED THEM THAT THEY NEEDED TO CARRY THE LOAN ON
16	THEIR BOOKS BECAUSE OF THE SPRINGING OBLIGATIONS
17	UNDER OUR LOAN ADMINISTRATION POLICY EVEN THOUGH
18	CIRM HAD FORGIVEN THE LOAN.
19	CHAIRMAN JUELSGAARD: FROM MY POINT OF
20	VIEW, IT MAKES SENSE THAT THAT WOULD BE THE CASE,
21	BUT I JUST WONDER WHAT SORT OF DUE DILIGENCE WE HAD
22	DONE BESIDES SIMPLY THAT INPUT FROM ONE OF THE LOAN
23	RECIPIENTS. THAT WAS THE NATURE OR THE REASON FOR
24	MY QUESTION.
25	ARE THERE ANY QUESTIONS FROM OTHER MEMBERS

1	OF THE COMMITTEE OR COMMENTS? ARE THERE ANY
2	QUESTIONS FROM THE PUBLIC AT THIS POINT, OR DO WE
