

hiPSC Initiative - Main Activities



RFA 12-02: Tissue Collection for Disease Modeling

- Consent donors
- Collect medical information
- Code medical information
- Collect tissues

RFA 12-03: hiPSC Derivation

- Preserve / expand primary source cells
- Derive & characterize hiPSC

RFA 12-04: hPSC Repository

- Store & distribute hPSC
- Store & distribute primary source cells
- Store & make available coded medical information

Provide Unique ID to 12-02

Transfer hiPSC to 12-02, if requested

Information

Transfer coded medical information to 12-04

Shipping Costs_

Pay for hiPSC shipping, if requesting

Pay for tissue shipping

Pay for hiPSC / cell shipping



RFA 12-04: hPSC Repository

- State and federal laws for the protection of research participants and medical information
- Maintain ability to re-contact, if consented

- Freedom to operate
- Assurance from viewers of private tissue donor information to not seek identity
- Facilitate re-contact, if consented

- meetings amongst hiPSC Initiative grantees


